Right now we are opening scheduling COVID vaccination appointments for Veteran patients 75 years or older. If you are interested in scheduling a COVID Vaccination appointment, please contact us at 1-800-382-8387. Our hours of operation are Monday thru Friday, 7am-6pm.

The Moderna COVID-19 vaccine is being administered throughout VA Northern California Health Care System (VANCHCS) via a phased plan. In addition to Veterans living in our Long Term Care facilities, VANCHCS will begin offering vaccines to Veterans who are at the highest risk of severe illness and death from COVID-19.

Your VA health care team will contact you as soon as you're eligible to get a vaccine. VANCHCS's goal is to vaccinate all Veterans who want it.

We follow CDC guidelines to determine who is at highest risk of severe illness and death from COVID-19. Factors that may influence the risk of severe disease include the following:
